Taylor County Middle School SBA Project Progress – Pam Gallaher

Ms. Gallaher informed the Board the Taylor County Middle School SBA Project was near the end and the followings topics were discussed: heat pump problems, awaiting on heat pump for the stage area, panhandle cleaning to clean the duct work for the Gymnasium and the Auditorium, the duct work and the air conditioner do not match and won't fit, bringing proposals for duct work that will fit the unit, do a change order if the proposal is excepted, there has been issues with the cameras interfering with the ceiling tile replacement and a meeting is scheduled at Taylor County Board of Education Office at 11:00 a.m. on February 28, 2018.

West Taylor Elementary School SBA Project Progress - Pam Gallaher

Ms. Gallaher informed the Board that the West Taylor Elementary School SBA Progress is going smoothly and on schedule. She gave the Board members am itemized chart of when each project would be completed and the following topics were discussed: the work is right on schedule, City Windows are wonderful to work with very professional, Board members was given a list of subcontractors being utilized and there is a meeting at West Taylor Elementary School at 1:00 p.m. on February 28, 2018.

RAJCO - Dara Britton

Ms. Britton elaborated to the Board the proposal which Mr. Watkins, from RAJCO, explained at the February 13, 2018 Board meeting. His company would negotiate with our utility companies to get a lower rate for the usage. When this is accomplished his company will get 40% and we will get 60% of the savings. They will also go back one year to recoup that savings as well with the same percentages distributed per entity. Angie Latta will be pulling the information which RAJCO will need. If she acquires any overtime RAJCO will reimburse us the overtime dollars she occurs.

Mr. Upton spoke regarding safety at the schools and wanting to work on an escape route from Taylor County Middle School so the students would be out of sight and target. Mr. Upton was glad to see Anna Jarvis Elementary School preparing to do an active shooting demonstration on March 10, 2018 at 9:00 a.m. Also discussed was the "Handle with Care" knowledge is transmitted via text to Ms. McCarthy, information is then texted from McCarthy to the school counselor, the school counselor checks on the student throughout the day.

18-08-8000 BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS/DISCUSSION

The Board discussed a meeting scheduled for March 20, 2018 at 5:00 p.m. at the Taylor County Board of Education office which would include local law enforcement and the board of education members. This meeting is the beginning of a number of meetings to help decrease the number of safety concerns in our county.

Mr. Upton informed the Board of a conference call in which he participated with all board presidents and the president of the State Board of Education and the following topics were discussed: 5900 teachers in the capital, want PEIA to have a long term settlement, town hall meetings, using teachers to leverage taxes for gas, \$80 million dollars per year from tax on soda, only person that can order staff back to work is a circuit court judge, attorney general has no power to open schools, 37 proclamation letters were received by the State Board of Education, and teachers bringing in food and packing up back packs for children.

Mr. Tucker said that we have a fine group of businesses and people in Taylor County. People has shown great support, churches, Toothman Ford and many more I'm sure, have donated food for the children and staff.

The Board scheduled a meeting for Tuesday, March 20, 2018 at 5:00 p.m. at the Taylor County Board of Education office for a safety committee meeting.
